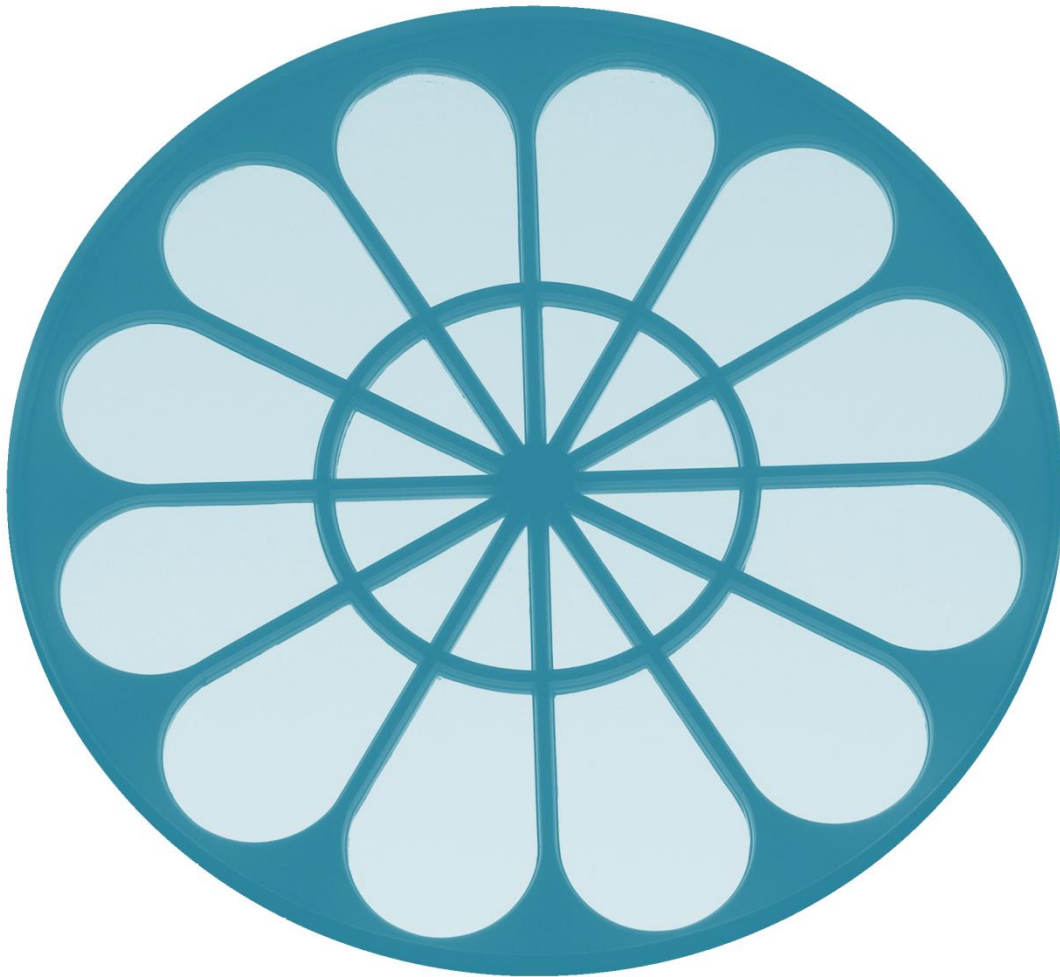

About this Publication

This publication represents the work of a committee of the vestry during the summer 2012 and is updated by the church staff annually. Committee members identified the various commissions and ministries at Trinity-by-the-Cove to determine which were operative, which needed attention, and how they fit into the overall ministry structure at Trinity-by-the-Cove. Once the commissions and ministries were identified, committee members collected information about the ministries and activities at Trinity-by-the-Cove. This publication is a compilation of the committee's work. This publication has already been used by clergy to evaluate and discuss ministries at Trinity-by-the-Cove and there is potential for its future use, including:

MINISTRIES & ACTIVITIES AT TRINITY

Each ministry is unique; however, there are some general categories of ministry at Trinity-by-the-Cove. Ministries are listed in this publication by alphabetical order. The categories are listed below and the index in the back of this publication offers a list of ministries by category.

WORSHIP: This category refers to ministries that are closely related to our worship services, including those on Sunday and throughout the week.

SERVICE: This category refers to ministries that relate to Trinity-by-the-Cove reaching out to help those in need, including people in our parish family, in Naples, Collier County, and throughout the world.

FORMATION: This category refers to ministries that offer time for fellowship and study about God, ranging from classes on religion, theology, spirituality, and Bible study to opportunities to gather and share life stories and friendship.

FRIENDSHIP: This category refers to ministries that offer time for parishioners to gather together as friends and family, ranging from large weekend gatherings to Sunday activities and other special events.

EVANGELISM & COMMUNICATIONS: This category refers to ministries that bring the good news of Jesus Christ into the world and strengthen the faith of parishioners and visitors who come to Trinity-by-the-Cove, including ways we communicate what Trinity-by-the-Cove is doing to bring people closer to God.

PASTORAL CARE: This category refers to ministries that bring direct and personal care to people in trouble, sorrow, sickness, need or any other adversity. These ministries include the pastoral care offered by clergy and professional staff and other ministries supervised by clergy.

STEWARDSHIP & PLANNED GIVING: This category refers to ministries that act as stewards for money and other assets that God has given into our care and opportunities to teach how to be proper stewards of what God has given to us as individuals and as a parish community.

ACOLYTES

- Who:** Young Trinitarians, typically age 10 to 18 and at least 5 feet tall
- What:** Acolytes are young Trinitarians who serve during liturgies by carrying the processional crosses and torches and by assisting the priest with the offering plates, the proclamation of the Gospel, and the preparation of the altar.

- Why:** To assist in the liturgies of the church.

ADULT FORMATION

- Who:** Volunteers to participate
- What:** Adult formation consists of a series of adult forums on Sunday morning that vary in content and are often based on a book that the class is reading.

ALBERGUE EL BUEN SAMARITANO

- Who:** Volunteers to assist
- What:** The Albergue El Buen Samaritano in San Francisco de Macoris, Dominican Republic is a program that offers children shelter and education each day, providing breakfast, lunch, personal hygiene teaching and learning in a loving and safe environment. These children would be on the street if it were not for the Albergue (shelter in Spanish). This service opportunity is in partnership with Naples area Episcopal Churches. Each year around Christmas time there is an opportunity for donors to offer scholarships to the children and there are mission trips from time to time.

What: The Archangel Fund for Collier County Charities, administered by Trinity-by-the-Cove, receives funds raised by the Art of Giving events, the Olde Naples Arts & Entertainment Festival, and the Women of Trinity and distributes those funds to local charities selected by the Community Grant Commission.

AUDIT

Who: Members of the Finance Commission
What: Each year an audit is performed relative to the church's financial operation.

- Why:** Holy Baptism is the full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's body the Church.

- What:** Christian burial, whenever possible, is preceded by a worship service held at church. The service of Christian burial is found in the Book of Common Prayer and clergy are available to assist anyone planning a funeral service. A copy of *Guidelines for Funeral Planning at Trinity-by-the-Cove* is available in the parish office or narthex of the church.

CALLIOPE

What: The Calliope was built for Trinity-by-the-Cove by the Miner Calliope Company of Kirksville, Missouri and given to the Glory of God by Walter Carroll, Jr. It is air-driven, and has forty-three solid brass whistles, with a chromatic compass beginning at F below middle C. It plays on static wind pressure, directly from the blower, on twenty inches of wind, and can be heard from a great distance. It can be played from the keyboard (the key action is mechanical), or by an automatic player mechanism with a perforated paper roll. It is played outdoors on special occasions.

CHILDREN'S FORMATION: CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Who: Volunteers to assist

What: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a unique and exciting Christian formation program for children ages 3 through 12. The curriculum combines the spiritual vision, imagination, and creativity of our children with the foundation of Holy Scripture and the liturgy of our church worship. Based upon the Montessori method of learning, the program guides the children with presentations and provides hands-on materials to explore and investigate Christian tradition and themes.
