Rector's Message

I've been watching our mango tree bloom. Perhaps I'm more attuned to flowering plants because I have terrible allergies this year, but I'm confident it will be the best crop of mangos we've ever had. I think it's because the tree was zapped by Ian floodwaters, spent a year recovering, and now is ready to give its best fruit. Sounds good and reasonable, doesn't it?

As I had this thought, I had another. I could be completely wrong. It could be flowering as it ever has. I'm not an expert on fruit or mango trees or storm impact, which brings me to the spiritual practice of daring to be completely wrong. Watching the world around us and diving into Scripture are practices we should all engage in as Christians seeking to grow. Piecing our knowledge and experience together and trying to work out the world around us is good and holy. Allowing those thoughts and experiences to gel into opinions and theories helps us make sense of our lives, the world, and how God might be at work in both. The trick about the spiritual practice of daring to be completely wrong is to take the sprouting theory or opinion and research. Look more deeply. Bring in the opinions of family and friends. Consult experts.

What does that mean for my mango theory? I remember one parishioner telling me that mangos bloom better every other year. I googled "bad year for mangos" and found a tropical fruit forum. I saw one note from someone claiming to be a farmer who wrote, "Biennial bearing (or alternate) bearing is a term used in pomology to refer to trees with an irregular crop load from year to year. The Florida Extension of the University of Florida has a four-page document addressing common questions concerning mango trees. And then bingo, a 95-page document with links to many resources and even a quote from St. Hildegard von Bingen, "In the fruit trees are hidden certain of God's secrets which only the blessed among men can perceive."

As you look out at the world, reflect on your life, and wonder about Jesus, what truth, opinion, or theory is scratching at your curiosity? Might you dare to be completely wrong? Then, look more deeply. Share your thoughts with family and friends. Consult experts.

I don't know if my theory on the fruiting mango tree is right or wrong. In searching for the answer, I've learned, and I've enjoyed thinking about God's creation, how something as awful as a hurricane might bear fruit. I've now considered how to bear more spiritual fruit for God's kingdom in this day I've been given. And I'm confident I'm no expert and cannot wait for a fresh mango. Cast your thoughts on God, wrestle, research, and wait for insight—whether an answer to your original thought or something even better.

Holy Week Services March 28th, 29th, 30th, and FIVE on Easter Sunday!

Holy week begins with Palm Sunday on March 24th with our regularly scheduled Sunday services. Maundy Thursday is March 28th with washing of feet and Holy Eucharist at 5:30 p.m. with the prayer watch following. Good Friday is March 29th with our Noonday Service, which includes the Passion Reading, Prayers, and Devotions before the cross. The Easter Vigil takes place at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday March 30th. Five services on Easter morning, with the addition of the 6:30 a.m. Sunrise Service.

So as you go about your daily schedule,

think of at least one person to invite to one event, for this one month - 1:1:1, it's that easy!

Four Thoughts for Lent

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. Book of Common Prayer, p. 265.

As we reflect on how we will observe a holy Lent, consider the words from our prayer book and the story of Jesus in the wilderness where he experienced hunger, the need for help, and the temptation of falling away from God's will. Over the forty days of Lent, give thought to four avenues to deepen your spiritual experience.



Prayers of Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is offered to God for all the blessings of this life, for our redemption, and for whatever draws us closer to God.

Prayers of Intercession and Petition

Intercession brings before God the needs of others; in petition, we present our own needs, that God's will may be done.

Think about the world. What are your hopes? What are your fears or anxieties? Think about your parish family. What are your hopes? How can you love? Spend time at a desk or table with paper and pencil. Write down a prayer. Need help? Some steps you might walk:

- † Open your Book of Common Prayer to page 810 and following.
- † Look through the prayers, pick one that resonates or
- t Using the prayers as an example, craft your own.
- † Write the prayer on a card and keep it someplace near your daily habits—bedside table, coffee maker, car.
- † Say the prayer daily during Lent.

Might You...

...Discern your Spiritual Gits

Reflect on how you can best serve, using your Spiritual Gifts. As Christians we are all members of Christ's Body and all called to ministry. This involves discerning our God-given gifts and then using them in his service, not for our own good, but "for the building up of the body of Christ" into the full stature of Christ (Ephesians 4:12). Give yourself time in Lent to learn about how to identify your gifts and use them to God's glory and the welfare of his Church. It all begins with a cup of coffee with your priest.

Lenten Practices March 3-17, 2024

Lent is a season of self-reflection – a time for soul-searching and personal growth. It's not uncommon for people to take up one spiritual practice and try to keep it up throughout the season, and perhaps beyond. This year, what if your 'one thing' is to try four different things – fourth spiritual practices to enhance your journey through Lent and beyond.

Faith-Seeking Journey News: The Gifts of God, For the People of God

Each Sunday at the Holy Eucharist, the Celebrant offers the Bread and Wine —which we have presented as the offering of our life and labor to the Lord, and which have become for us, the sacrament of His Body and Blood as "the gifts of God, for the people of God." This miracle of transformation is a sign and channel of our life in Christ: as

we offer our life to God, God returns our life to us, as His own life, to be received by faith.

In The Faith-Seeking Journey we as the People of God also give gifts to those who have come to us seeking to share our life in Christ. As they have shared their stories with us, we have shared our story with them, and their stories have become a part of our story. When they were formally admitted to the Formation Period of The Faith-Seeking Journey, we gave each Seeker a Bible, as "the Word of God, containing all things necessary for salvation.

On the First Sunday of Lent, the Faith-Seekers were enrolled as Candidates for Baptism, Confirmation, Reception into this branch of Christ's Church; or for the Reaffirmation of their Baptismal



Vows, before the Bishop; and we gave them then The Book of Common Prayer, as a resource for living a prayerful life among us, as a people of prayer, guided daily by the Holy Spirit.

During Lent, we will also give these Candidates the Nicene Creed, as a Rule and Standard of our Faith, and a sign of Jesus' promise to His Disciples that the Holy Spirit will guide us into all Truth. St Paul says that through Baptism, we were buried with Christ in His death, so that we may walk in newness of life. The Bible, The Prayer Book and the Creed are resources for living our life in Christ. They are gifts of God to His people, and as His people, we gift them to those who seek to share our life of faith.

Thursdays at Trinity

Pray.Eat.Grow

For the last two years we have offered a mid-week evening program, Pray. Eat. Grow. The beautiful choral evensongs, delicious meals (the best deal in town!), and engaging formation offerings were well-loved by many in our parish family. Many found that it was just what they needed to re-center themselves in the midst of the busyness of life, get together in Christian community, and grow in faith. As a result we are delighted to continue to offer this program in the year ahead and hope that more parishioners (and friends!) will come and see what all the talk is about. The program will continue every Thursday throughout the year until Easter. It is an opportunity to come together as a parish family on Thursday evenings for a beautiful choral evensong service in the church (5:30-6:00 p.m.), followed by a delicious dinner in the Parish Hall (6:00-6:45 p.m.), and formation offerings for the whole family (6:45-7:30 p.m.).

The adult formation offering will rotate throughout the year and cover a variety of topics from Praying The Lord's Prayer to the Art of Advent, from the Evensong Canticles to some significant moments in Church History – all different ways to grow in love of God and neighbor.

In March we will continue the series "Reflections on Church History" with Fr. Tad Meyer. Rather than an overly-academic history class, this series will stop at some of the more interesting and exciting moments in the history of the Church to comment on their significance and ongoing importance. Then, on March 14th we will have our next Thursday Night Out Speaker Series event, a "Spotlight on Ukrainian Culture" with Taras Filenko. This program is part of pianist Taras Filenko's ongoing effort to bring Ukrainian culture, particularly music, in focus for American audiences. Come for the whole time or for whatever parts you can make -- and pray, eat, and grow together in faith.

Thursday Night Out

Our next Thursday Night Out will take place on March 14th at 6:30 p.m., after our regularly scheduled Choral Evensong service at 5:30 p.m. in the church and dinner at 6:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

Our guest will be Dr. Taras Filenko, a noted scholar and performer of Ukrainian music. A graduate of the National Academy of Music in Kyiv, he went on to serve as a member of the faculty and eventually as Associate Dean of Conducting and Voice. From the Academy, he was awarded a Ph.D. in historic musicology in 1989, later



earning a doctorate in Ethnomusicology from the University of Pittsburgh in 1998. For over forty years, Taras has worked in the fields of History of Music, Ethnomusicology, and Music Performance (piano, organ, and choir directing), successfully combining his work as scholar, teacher, and performer. He has presented concerts throughout Europe and North America, making numerous media appearances promoting the works of contemporary Ukrainian composers. Taras is a recipient of Fulbright and Petesh Scholarships. The themes of his academic publications (more than 100) embrace ethnic studies, musical culture and

politics, ethnomusicology, and music and poetry. Together with his mother, Tamara Bulat, he authored The World of Mykola Lysenko: Ethnic Identity, Music Culture and Politics (2001).

This program is part of Taras's ongoing effort to bring Ukrainian culture, particularly music, in focus for American audiences. These concerts present a unique combination of artists and repertoire. In addition to music, the concerts usually include a selection of Ukrainian poetry presented in the original language and English translation. A visual element is provided by projected images, including Ukrainian art works, both historical and contemporary, as well as current photos of Ukraine.

Good Friday Meditation

Listen to Bach's St. Matthew Passion on Good Friday

For centuries Christians have made it a central practice of their faith to meditate on the words of Scripture. This is true at all times, but especially so during the high holy days. One traditional practice on Good Friday, for instance, is the Three Hours Devotion, a serious of meditations on the seven last words of Jesus from the cross. Another is the

Passion Oratorio, typically performed on Good Friday, in which great church composers give musical expression to this act of meditation on the passion narratives. By doing so, they also give future generations a powerful means of entering deeply into the profound drama of our faith.

Almost without question, the most prolific and magnificent example of this legacy of musical meditations (or musical sermons) on Scripture, comes from the pen of J. S. Bach. Bach wrote three full cycles of Church Cantatas for the entire liturgical year (two of which survive), as well as magisterial works for the high holy days, which are some of the most glorious choral works ever written. One of these, the St. Matthew Passion, takes the passion narrative from the Gospel of Matthew and sets it to music.

The St. Matthew Passion is an incredibly rich and complex work. One of the ways that Bach's musical setting aids Christians in meditating on the significance of the passion narrative is through the alternation of simple narrative

In other words, it is as if each section of the passion story has been culled for deep spiritual insight which is then applied first to the individual Christian and then to the whole Christian assembly by means of some of the most moving music ever written.

As a result, many have found it profoundly beneficial – a truly holy and spiritually nourishing practice – to meditate on our Lord's passion and death by listening to one of Bach's Passion settings on Good Friday.


