"Almighty God, on this day you opened the way of eternal life to every race and nation by the promised gift of your Holy Spirit: Shed abroad this gift throughout the world by the preaching of the Gospel..." – Collect for the Day of Pentecost, Book of Common Prayer

Trinity "In-House" Volunteer Opportunity - Sunday Greeter

What is a Greeter and why are they important?

Greeters are the first point of contact for visitors and newcomers to our parish. A simple smile and warm greeting let new people know they are welcome at our worship service.

What exactly does a Greeter do?

Greeters wear their name tag and arrive 20-30 minutes before the beginning of the service.

They stand outside the front door of the church and warmly greet all who are arriving, intentionally seeking out those who are new. They introduce themselves and invite new guests to coffee hour.

At coffee hour, let the new person lead the conversation, but offer to introduce them to other parishioners, and answer questions. Try to sense if they want to chat or be left alone.

If visitors would like to get information about Trinity, ask them to sign the guest book and share their email address.



Elevated & Resilient Church

In response to major flooding from Hurricanes Ian and Milton (Ian flooding right), the Vestry formed the Storm Resilience Committee to discern how best to protect our sacred spaces for generations to come. After study, listening, and prayer, the Committee unanimously recommended replicating our beautiful church at a higher elevation and to modern codes (rendering below). The Vestry agreed-and has now appointed a Building Committee to carry the project forward. We're grateful to the following parishioners who have agreed to serve: John Eick (Chair), Mark Borelli, Mark Goebel, Helene McGill (Treasurer), Kathryn Morgan, and Jay Morgeson. As their work begins, regular updates and parish forums will help keep everyone informed and engaged. Elevated & Resilient Church

1. Since the Vestry's decision, what have been the next steps?

After voting unanimously to replicate the church at a higher elevation, the Vestry appointed a Building Committee to steward the next phase of planning. The committee has been meeting regularly and, through a competitive bid and interview process, selected D. Garrett Construction as our Construction Manager. We are now working closely with our architect to refine the design and prepare for the next phases of development.

2. Who is the architect?

The project is being led by McWard & Associates, specifically architects Wil Ward and Jan Ward. The firm, founded in Naples in 1986 by Wil and Jan, brings over 35 years of local architectural expertise. Wil has completed over 260 commercial and residential projects in Southwest Florida, blending structural insight, local knowledge, and aesthetic vision. Jan Ward excels at integrating spatial function with interior detail for a seamless, warm design. They've collaborated with Trinity-by-the-Cove for over two decades: designing the Sunday School wing, the elevated Parish Hall, and various renovation efforts. Notably, Jan's parents, Lorry and Clyde McBride, were long-time church members and are laid to rest in the West Churchyard—adding deep personal connection to their work.

3. Who is the Construction Manger?

Following a competitive bid process, the Building Committee selected D. Garrett Construction as our construction manager, a trusted Naples-based firm with over 40 years of experience in high-quality building in Naples. They successfully managed the elevated Parish Hall project and led emergency restorations after Hurricanes Ian and Milton. For this church project, Bruce Gilbert will be the lead, and we'll benefit from the same superintendent who worked on the elevated Parish Hall project and who knows our site and standards well—ensuring consistency and confidence throughout the build.

4. What's exciting about this project?

This is a unique opportunity to preserve the sacred beauty of our beautiful church while preparing it for the future. The new building will look and feel like Trinity—but be elevated above flood levels, fully accessible, equipped for modern ministry, and up to current wind codes. It's a faithful blend of tradition and resilience, built to serve generations to come. We're not alone in this work. Naples Community Church is also rebuilding—transforming their space into a sanctuary designed for growth and hurricane resilience. Like us, they're responding to a shared coastal need: to build well above flood levels for strength, safety, and lasting ministry.

5. How can I help?



Music at Trinity-by-the-Cove

I'm pleased to present the Music at Trinity concert series for the 2025-2026 season! I am certain that the lineup of performers for this season will provide great variety, artistry and great enjoyment for all music lovers.

Our season begins on Sunday October 19th with a recital by emerging cellist **Gabriel Martins**. Mr. Martins is a Brazilian-American cellist who has collected a rather extensive list of accolades such as the Sphinx Competition Gold Medal, the David Popper International Cello Competition Gold Medal, and the Concert Artists Guild/Young Classical Artists Trust Grand Prize. *The Strad Magazine* declared his New York City recital debut as "flawlessly played.... a deeply moving experience" and *Classic FM* named him one of their "30 under 30" Rising Stars. His Trinity program features a wonderful pairing of old and new: Bach's Cello Suite No. 1 with its unmistakable first movement prelude, some pieces composed by Martins himself, and ending with Zoltán Kodály's Sonata for Solo Cello.





In November we will once again welcome one of America's most accomplished choirs, the Twin Cities based **Cantus**. Cantus is an ensemble of 8 gentlemen, and it is one of only two full-time jobs for choral singers in the U.S. Now in its 30th anniversary season, they've been recognized by *The Washington Post* for "exalting finesse" and "expressive power". Working without a conductor, the members of Cantus rehearse and perform as chamber musicians, each contributing to the entirety of the artistic process. Cantus performs at Trinity-by-the-Cove on Sunday, November 16th.

Our annual **Christmas by the Cove** choir carol concerts in December will of course feature the customary two performances of the Christmas choir concert on Saturday December 13th and Sunday December 14st. Make sure to sign up fast as these concerts always reach capacity!



2025-2026 Concert Series

Turning the calendar to 2026, in January we will welcome another period instrument Baroque ensemble, a genre I have worked hard to cultivate on our concert series as there is hardly any of this type of performance in Naples. Our guest ensemble will be **Echoing Air**. Hailing from Indianapolis, the group is comprised of two countertenors, recorders, and basso continuo. Their name is inspired by a well-known song by Henry Purcell "Hark, the Echoing Air", and as such they place an emphasis on music of the English Baroque.

Our February concert might be my most eagerly anticipated, as it marks the first time in our series that we present not one but two first class choirs on our concert season. **Ensemble Altera** is a very newly formed group but they

are quickly skyrocketing, being described by the BBC as "something extraordinary" and "a leading ensemble on the American choral scene" (*Scherzo Magazine*). Regarding their debut recording, "The Journey" the Preis der deutschen Lamb's Schallplattenkritik (German Record Critics' Award) stated that "no recent recording debut in this field has been as spectacular". This will be their first tour to Florida and quite simply run, don't walk to Trinity on Sunday February 15th. Might you have the spiritual gift of hospitality?: the members of Ensemble Altera have agreed to stay in parishioner homes to help keep costs reasonable, which for 15 individuals is rather significant. Our season concludes on March 8th with GRAMMY winning guitarist Jason Vieaux. Those of you who love classical guitar won't want to miss this one! We haven't had a guitarist since I've been at Trinity and this instrument will sound wonderful in our intimate church. Jason Vieaux is one of the most elite guitarists performing today, and *Gramophone Magazine* went so far as to call him "perhaps the most precise and soulful classical guitarist of his generation." He has toured throughout the world, and teaches both the Curtis Institute of Music and the Cleveland Institute of Music.

I can't wait to share these amazing artists with you! Further details and information on how to support the Friends of Music will be forthcoming during the summer. I thank you in advance for your participation and support and can't wait to welcome you to the concerts!



Pastoral Care and More

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." Ecclesiastes begins. (3:1-8). Our lives are filled with seasons, and this particular passage gives us the breadth of life, from things that happen to us – a time to be born a time to die and those times in which have more agency – a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted... a time to embrace. There is time for all things in God's plan. These times are also marked in our liturgical seasons. We are in the season after Pentecost and it is a time of growth and reflection. For many, it is also a time of refreshment.

Recently, I have been thinking about seasons and time in my life. Right now, I enjoy my little home, making a few changes in it. I love watching my little dog Charley spend his evenings patrolling the perimeter of my yard, ensuring that it remains lizard-free. The quieter summer months are a season to rest, visit with family and friends, and plan for the coming year. God gives us the time for all things and I offer this time to him as I do these things.



I talked with a friend the other day and she was looking for a change in her home. She did not want to move to a new place but needed "refresh" in her house. She wanted a new season for her nest. Another friend spent most of last year traveling both far and wide to places in this beautiful world. She is now ready to be a little more settled.

And like humans the rest of creation is in a season of recharge and refreshment. Here in Naples the weather has begun to turn warm and heavy with humidity.
