Rector's Message

Scripture tells us that some have welcomed angels without knowing it. At Trinity-by-the-Cove, we know this to be true. Week after week, in quiet moments of prayer, in a smile at coffee hour, in a whispered hymn (I know some of you only sing in your head) or a child's question about God, grace appears. Angels arrive.

We are a community that welcomes, that builds up, that casts our nets faithfully—even when the waters are uncertain. Perhaps that's why we're given the vision of evangelists as anglers.

As I return from vacation, I do so with a full heart. I'm deeply grateful for the vibrant ministry unfolding at Trinity—and yet also mindful and wary of Hurricane Season. With Hurricane Helene's damage in North Carolina and the approach of the 20th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina, I'm reminded how precious and vulnerable sacred spaces can be. Even as we plan and grow, we remain rooted in prayer and resilience.

As the school year begins, we are witnessing signs of renewal across our parish life. In Cursillo, parishioners are rediscovering the power of Christian community and the call to serve with joy. In Children and Youth Formation, a new, thoughtful curriculum draws from *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* and other Episcopal resources—preserving what we love about our atria and Sunday School while making formation more accessible for working parents and time-limited volunteers. Our steady ministries—Women of Trinity, Daughters of the King, Music at Trinty, Sunday Forums, Men of Trinity Breakfasts and much more—continue to offer prayer, fellowship, and strength at the heart of our shared life.

We're also leaning into the joy of intergenerational offerings. Thie Fishing Tournament, of course, but also Rally Day when will gather all ages to explore ministries that shape our worship and community life. And on Sunday, August 17, after the *Back to School Blessing*, we'll hold an informational session for anyone—parents, grandparents, godparents, and others—interested in supporting this sacred work with children.

At the same time, through the Elevated Church Project, we are responding faithfully and boldly to the damage caused by Hurricanes Ian and Milton—rising to build a church that is beautiful, resilient, and ready to serve for generations to come.

These are more than just programs or projects. They are signs of the Holy Spirit moving among us—calling us back to what matters most: worship, formation, service, hospitality, and hope.

So thank you. Thank you for your presence. Thank you for praying, for giving, for showing up in small and steady ways. Trinity is not just a building—it's a people. A people who have faced floods and loss, and still gather to sing. A people who teach children to wonder. A people who dare to dream, to build, and to cast out again into the deep.

Elevated & Resilient Church

In response to major flooding from Hurricanes Ian and Milton (Ian flooding right), the Vestry formed the Storm Resilience Committee to discern how best to protect our sacred spaces for generations to come. After study, listening, and prayer, the Committee unanimously recommended replicating our beautiful church at a higher elevation and to modern codes (rendering below). The Vestry agreed-and has now appointed a Building Committee to carry the project forward. We're grateful to the following parishioners who have agreed to serve: John Eick (Chair), Mark Borelli, Mark Goebel, Helene McGill (Treasurer), Kathryn Morgan, and Jay Morgeson. As their work begins, regular updates and parish forums will help keep everyone informed and engaged. Elevated Church Project: Summer Progress Update

Over the past several weeks, meaningful progress has been made in the design development for our new elevated church.

The land survey is complete, and the finished floor elevation has been set—raising the church just over four feet, the maximum height permitted by the City while preserving the building's historic proportions.

Our architects at McWard have developed a preliminary site plan, as well as draft floor plans for the nave, narthex, and sacristy, along with a detailed front elevation and organ mezzanine design. The Building Committee met on July 17 to review and comment on these drawings.

The site plan approval process is now underway, with a pre-application meeting already held with City officials. We are pleased to report that the Building Committee has recommended D. Garrett Construction Company to serve as our construction manager. A representative from D. Garrett joined our July meeting and will be a key member of the team moving forward.

Because acoustics are essential to worship and music, we have also engaged the internationally respected firm Kirkegaard to serve as acousticians. They will guide the architectural team on room geometry and materials to ensure excellent sound quality. Kirkegaard will visit the site on August 9–10 – you may see them at services and coffee hour on Sunday the 10th.

Work continues steadily, and we remain on track to begin construction in early fall 2026. Thank you for your continued prayers and support!

What is an Acoustician?

Whether it's the resonance of the organ, the beauty of choral singing, or the intimacy of a concert, acousticians shape how sacred sound brings people into deeper connection with God and one another.

We are pleased to be working with Kirkegaard, one of the most respected acoustical consulting firms in the world. Based in Chicago, Kirkegaard has worked on some of the most celebrated concert halls, opera houses, and worship spaces—known for blending scientific expertise with a deep sensitivity to music and spoken word. Their past church work includes spaces where clarity, reverence, and beauty come together in every hymn and homily. Their guidance will help us ensure that our new church not only looks like Trinity-by-the-Cove, but *sounds* like home too.

Let's Talk Sound: Coffee Chat with Fr. Edward – August 10

As we plan for a new and replicated church that honors our traditions and supports parish life, one key question arises: how should it sound? (We'll talk about all our rooms, not just the church.)

On Sunday, August 10, after the 10 a.m. service, join Fr. Edward for a Coffee Chat about acoustics—how sound has shaped our experience of worship, preaching, concerts, dinners, forums, and conversation.

We'll reflect on what's worked well (and what hasn't!) in both the church and parish hall, and hear how Kirkegaard, world-renowned acousticians, can help us create a space that supports both reverent silence and joyful sound.

Restoring a Sacred Space

An Update on the Sunday School Atria

Ah, summertime in Naples... For those of us here year-round, it's a season of less hustle, shorter drive times, and quieter dinners at our favorite restaurants. It's a peaceful pause in seasonal business - and usually, in the church office, we use this time to plan for the new program year, complete projects, and maybe even sneak in a vacation day or two. But this summer has felt quite different.



The last few months we've been restoring the Sunday School Atria from damage caused by Hurricane Milton last fall. The hammering and sawing, the dust and the mess-it's been anything but quiet and slow around here. Electricians, plumbers, contractors – sometimes all at once. As I write this, I'm realizing just how ready I am for this project to be finished... and thankfully, it almost is. The final work is being done, and then we'll welcome the professional cleaning crew!

I think it's a good time to remind our church family what was involved in this restoration. It wasn't just about repairing the damage—it was also about making the space stronger and more flood-resistant for the future. We took a

close look at how we could better protect these rooms, and I wanted to share a few of the things we did in the Atria, the Church Mouse, and the maintenance office:

- Replaced laminate floors with durable, easy-to-clean epoxy flooring
- Cut out and replaced drywall with flood-resistant PVC wallboard up to 36"
- Installed PVC baseboards and trim for easy removal and cleaning
- Raised all electrical outlets to 48" from the floor
- Replaced all cabinetry with starboard (PVC-like) material
- In the Church Mouse, replaced built-in pressboard cabinetry with mobile carts to move quickly if needed
- Invested in new flood barriers for all doors and some windows learn more at Xeroflood.com




With God's help and your support, we are now better prepared for future storms. Most importantly, we're ready to welcome back our children to a space designed with both beauty and resilience in mind.

FAITH SEEKING

JOURNEY

Faith Seeking Journey (September to May)

This year-long program led by Fr. Steve is addressed to the desire people have to discover God. It is an attempt to provide them with the habits and resources that will enable them to seek him within the branch of the family of God known as the Episcopal Church, and it will initiate them into the mystery of Christian experience through the sacraments, within the course of the liturgical year. It aims to transform lives, by providing participants with the resources to live the Christian life in today's world. If you are new to Trinity, new to the Episcopal Church, or want to grow in your faith and get more involved at Trinity, this is the journey for you!

Narnia for Grown-Ups featuring Dr. Terry Lindvall (September 21-November 2, 2025)

C. S. Lewis' fantasy children series, *The Chronicles of Narnia*, sparked a cottage industry with their global popularity. "Narnia for Grownups" will be a light-hearted seven-week course exploring and playing with theological themes and subtle insights throughout C. S. Lewis classic stories. We will hop and amble through each of the seven books, beginning with *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* and ending with the Apocalyptic *The Last Battle*. Grown-up "students" are encouraged to read each book the week before, but may still attend class if they haven't, but may still be teased by Professor Terry Lindvall. Be a kid again, even if it is just to play hooky!



Nicaea at 1700: Exploring the Nicene Creed (November 9-December 21, 2025)

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (AD 325), which gave us among other things the Nicene Creed which we profess every Sunday. After briefly exploring the historical importance of the Creed and Council, we will examine its continued relevance through a discussion of what it all means! You may even find, after we're through, that you are reciting the Creed on Sunday mornings with a deeper appreciation and understanding of the faith we confess.

Heaven: The Heart's Deepest Longing (January 11-February 8, 2026)

What do you want? *Really* want? Using the human heart as our guide and Peter Kreeft's book of Heaven as our map, we will examine the psychological, philosophical, and theological dimensions of this search for total joy and for the ultimate reality that grounds it. Along the way we'll explore the heart's restlessness, why heaven is not boring (!), the nature of our ultimate hope, and what difference heaven makes to Monday morning.

Lenten Meditations on Scripture through Art with Jim Pagliaro (March 1-22, 2026)

Join art historian and fellow parishioner Jim Pagliaro along with Fr. Nicholas as we explore some artistic depictions of the passion and death of Jesus Christ during the season of Lent. We will lead meditations on Scriptural passages through visual renditions by some of Europe's greatest artists, including Giotto, Hans Holbein the Elder, Tintoretto, Titian, Cimabue, and more. — Fr. 
MEN'S THURSDAY BIBLE STUDY

A New Ministry Begins

Grief is a natural part of this life, and a part of the



journey of healing from loss. loss of his friend,

Lazarus and the Lord consoled Martha and Mary in their distress. Those who experience the death of someone they love, need a place to grieve with others. Working through loss, and meaning making of that loss, are important for everyone who walks on this side of life. Beginning in October, Trinity-by-the-Cove will offer a series of Christ-centered grief workshops designed to heal the broken-hearted and bind up the wounds of loss, to usher in a new understanding of happiness.

Walking the Mourner's Path is a series of groupcentered workshops that guide the griever to heal in a safe place with facilitators who encourage and guide participants on that walk. It is a gentle program that slowly reveals what the Holy Spirit has to teach us. The program meets for an hour and a half for eight weeks. No set day has been calendared yet for the workshops. The day and time will depend upon the needs of participants. We would like to begin in mid-October to be finished before Christmas.

Mourner's Path was developed in 1995 by the Rev. Danielle Morris of the Diocese of Central Florida. Her work is continued through St. Anthony of the Desert, Scottsdale, Arizona which trains facilitators for this ministry within many church denominations throughout the United States. Participant workshops for those who grieve are also held there. Cookie Coleman and I participated in Walking the Mourner's Path training at St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Bonita Springs this past April and will be facilitating a "Walk" this fall.

If you feel that you have more healing to do around grieving the loss of someone you love, whether recently or in the distant past, or that you feel you are "stuck" in your grief, Walking the Mourner's Path might be helpful.
