

Rector's Message

I'm looking forward to pie! Yes, the key-lime pie of participation and our stewardship drive for the 2026 Annual Fund — but also pumpkin pie and cherry pie, my favorite. Thanksgiving arrives this month.

Thanksgiving naturally turns our hearts, imaginations, and prayers toward gratitude: for the people and places that make our lives full, for the beauty of creation, and for the quiet moments that remind us of God's nearness. Yet true thanksgiving asks more of us. It calls us to look beyond our own wants and to see the blessings that come when we are fully present to one another, especially within our parish family.

Each year at our Thanksgiving Eve Liturgy, we pray the Litany of Thanksgiving:

"Let us give thanks to God our Father for all God's gifts so freely bestowed upon us."

"For the beauty and wonder of your creation, in earth and sky and sea..."

"For minds to think, and hearts to love, and hands to serve..."

"For the communion of saints, in all times and places..."

Each phrase lifts our gaze a little higher, reminding us that thanksgiving is not just about what we have, but how we live — with open hearts, willing hands, and a spirit of delight. In that posture we grow in holiness and in our relationships with one another, learning to see each other as gifts of God's grace.

Our time preparing for Thanksgiving gives way to Advent. (The First Sunday of Advent is November 30th — time is flying, and I cannot wait for Advent Lessons & Carols!). Advent invites us to wait, to listen, and to hope — not in isolation, but together as a people who have learned to give thanks. Thanksgiving teaches us to pay attention; Advent teaches us to expect God's presence. One flows naturally into the other.

This growth is nurtured not only in the quiet prayers we offer — and in the silent thoughts you hold as you read these words — but also through your participation in the life we share. Sunday Forums that stretch our minds, sacred serving through Outreach and Habitat for Humanity, the joy of the Christmas Market, and the fellowship of Thursdays at Trinity-by-the-Cove all draw us deeper into gratitude and community. These are the ways we give thanks for one another and learn to see God at work.

As you gather around tables this month — and later around the Advent wreath — practice thanksgiving for all the blessings that come to heart and mind, and for all that is gracious in the lives of men and women, revealing the image of Christ. Let gratitude shape your waiting, your listening, and your hoping for the movement of God in our lives, in our parish family, and in our world.

Psalm 9:1

Charley's kitty, (not my kitty) LilyBelle usually takes her ease on the back porch during his fervent rounds in the yard. I am thankful for food and rest, and four-legged companionship.

I think of my life's vocation – just how did I get here? I certainly had a few career starts and stops, further exploration, lots of work and the leading of the Holy Spirit to get me this place and time as an ordained priest. I think of my friends and family, and my church family of Trinity-by-the-Cove. I am thankful for this ministry I have been called to and for the people I love and serve. I am thankful for all my relationships.

I think of the reason we are in this place in this time. We are here because of love. God's creation and God's creative works of the world are about relationship. We are created out of love and goodness. In Genesis it is written, "So God created humankind in his image in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. [Then]God blessed them." (v.1:27-28a). I am thankful for God's blessings.

May your Thanksgiving, whether around a traditional table filled with food and family friends, or a little more subdued, be a blessing of reflection and gratitude for all that we have been given by our Lord.

Praise with the Organ

We're Not Alone

Trinity Wall Street, New York City, where a new organ now fills this historic space with music once again.

Did you read the recent article about Trinity Wall Street's new organ? It's a story of resilience, vision, and the power of music to restore hope.

Their Gothic Revival church in Lower Manhattan, which withstood the tragedy of 9/11, also saw its beloved Aeolian-Skinner organ suffer devastating damage in the terrorist attacks. That organ, installed in 1923, was eventually deemed beyond repair. After years of planning, Trinity recently unveiled its magnificent replacement: a 10-year project, costing nearly \$17 million and boasting 8,041 pipes. At its debut concert, organist Anna Lapwood said, "You can really feel you are playing the building as well as the organ itself."

Theirs is a powerful story of loss transformed into beauty, of an instrument reborn to lift hearts and inspire. Their story resonates with us here in Naples.

Our Own Story at Trinity-by-the-Cove

Trinity-by-the-Cove: Praise with the Organ, responding to Hurricane Ian damage.

For us, the moment of reckoning came with Hurricane Ian. The storm brought floodwaters and rain into our sanctuary, destroying the console, pipes, and windchests of our Casavant organ, which had been faithfully leading worship since 1971. The damage, like at Trinity Wall Street, was too great to repair.

Faced with that reality, we, too, discerned that a new organ was needed — not simply as a replacement, but as a sign of hope and renewal. After months of careful study, consultation, and prayer, we selected Dobson Pipe Organ Builders to craft our new instrument.

A Vision for the Future

Our new organ will:

- **Include 1,861 pipes** crafted for both grandeur and subtlety.
- Be voiced specifically for our sanctuary, able to lead congregational song, accompany choirs, and inspire through concert music.

Be housed in a beautifully designed case that will enhance both the sound and the architecture of our church.

And importantly, the installation of this new organ has been incorporated into our **Raised and Resilient Church Project**, which ensures that our sacred space is not only restored but made stronger for generations to come.

Like Trinity Wall Street, we are discovering that even in the wake of loss, God can raise new beauty. When our organ is unveiled, it will not only be an instrument of music, but a testimony to resilience, faith, and the joy of God's presence among us.

"Praise him with strings and pipe...

Let everything that has breath praise the Lord!" (Psalm 150)

After hosting a most successful Mouse sale on October 18th, we quickly shift our attention to the Christmas Market Preview Party on Friday evening, November 14th.



Serving in our Community Youth Haven

Youth Haven provides a home, hope, and healing to abused and neglected children and teens in southwest Florida. They are Collier County's only emergency and residential shelter for boys and girls ages 6–21 who have been removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect, or abandonment.

Their team of dedicated professionals work together to provide a safe haven for SWFL children and teens ages 6 to 18. Their cottages provide a safe place to help children in the foster care system begin to heal. Youth Haven's compassionate staff strives for excellence by maintaining the highest professional and ethical standards. The 18 acre campus houses up to 74 youth and provides around the clock specialized care. Youth Haven helps each child gain confidence, independence, and success, laying the foundation for them to have hope for a brighter better future.

Trinity-by-the-Cove also supports Youth Haven every year a t Thanksgiving. Parishioners lovingly give of their time to prepare lunch for t h e residents, allowing their regular chef to



enjoy the holiday with his family.

Elevated & Resilient Church

In response to the flooding from Hurricanes Ian and Milton, the Vestry formed the Storm Resilience Committee to discern how best to protect our sacred spaces for generations to come. After careful study, listening, and prayer, the Committee unanimously recommended replicating our beautiful church at a higher elevation and to modern codes. The Vestry agreed—and has now appointed a Building Committee to carry the project forward.

The Building Committee (John Eick, Chair; Mark Borelli; Mark Goebel; Helene McGill, Treasurer; Kathryn Morgan; and Jay Morgeson) has begun its work in partnership with architect Wil Ward and construction manager Bruce Gilbert. Updates from the October meeting:

- Design & Planning: Architect Wil Ward is refining plans, including ceiling heights, memorial garden details, and coordination with site and landscape designs. Updated drawings will support a revised cost estimate in the coming weeks.
- City & Approval Process: Site plan submission is expected by November. City review, Design Review Board, and City Council approvals will follow, with full compliance prioritized to avoid delays.
- Campus & Garden Protections: Both memorial gardens will be safeguarded during construction with protective scaffolding and netting. Afterward, they will be raised two feet, preserving existing grass and markers. On the facing page is a pastoral letter from our Bishop on the memorial gardens.

These technical details may sound intricate, but they are the faithful work of ensuring our new church will be strong, beautiful, and resonant in worship for generations to come.

Sunday Forums Ahead

Faith Seeking Journey- September to May

This month we finish up our Narnia series – though, please do plan to come out and meet our presenter in person at this month's Thursday Night Out Speaker series event. And we look forward to many more wonderful offerings in the months

This year-long program led by Fr. Steve is addressed to the desire people have to discover God. It is an attempt to provide them with the habits and resources that will enable them to seek him within the branch of the family of God known as the Episcopal Church, and it will initiate them into the mystery of Christian experience through the sacraments, within the course of the liturgical year. It aims to transform lives, by providing participants with the resources to live the Christian life in today's world. If you are new to Trinity, new to the Episcopal Church, or want to grow in your faith and get more involved at Trinity, this is the journey for you!

Nicaea at 1700: Exploring the Nicene Creed (November 9th-December 21st, 2025)

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (AD 325), which gave us among other things the Nicene Creed which we profess every Sunday. After briefly exploring the historical importance of the Creed and Council, we will examine its continued relevance through a discussion of what it all means! You may even find, after we're through, that you are reciting the Creed on Sunday mornings with a deeper appreciation and understanding of the faith we confess.

Heaven: The Heart's Deepest Longing (January 11th-February 1st, 2026)

What do you want? *Really* want? Using the human heart as our guide and Peter Kreeft's book of Heaven as our map, we will examine the psychological, philosophical, and theological dimensions of this search for total joy and for the ultimate reality that grounds it. Along the way we'll explore the heart's restlessness, why heaven is not boring (!), the nature of our ultimate hope, and what difference heaven makes to Monday morning.

Destroying the Idols of the Mind — The Faith-Seeking Journey moves on to Hearing God's Word

On the First Sunday of Advent, the first Sunday in the Church Year, The Faith-Seeking Journey will enter a new stage, called The Formation Period. It is a time for focusing on how we hear and respond to the Word of God in the Liturgy of the Word each Sunday.

It is not easy to hear God's Word, but each week we gather as the Church, as people called by God to assemble to hear God speak to us, in the Lessons of Scripture, the Sermon and the Prayers of the People. The Sixteenth Century philosopher, Francis Bacon, believed that it is very hard for the Truth to break through the barriers we erect in our minds. He named these barriers idols, and he listed four:

- "Idols of the Tribe", which are common to the race human limitations.
- "Idols of the Den," which are peculiar to the individual personal prejudices.
- "Idols of the Marketplace," coming from the misuse of language cultural bias.

"Idols of the Theatre," which stem from philosophical dogmas — ideologies

Bacon believed "we must destroy these idols, which have led experience captive, and childishly triumphed over the works of God. In the Liturgy of the Word, we prepare to hear the Word of God, by praying for God to "cleanse the thoughts of our hearts," and by collecting the themes of the Lessons into a prayer, before we hear the Lessons.

Members of the Faith-Seeking Journey will receive a Bible on the First Sunday of Advent, as they are admitted into the Formation Period, to reflect on God's Word in the "written word" of Scripture and the "spoken word" of the Church's proclamation in the Liturgy of the Word.

Pilgrimage

Pilgrimage 2026: In the Steps of Peter and Paul

Pilgrimage has long been one of the Church's most meaningful spiritual traditions—stepping away from the ordinary to seek God in extraordinary places. In 2026, Trinity-by-the-Cove invites parishioners and friends to join **Fr. Edward Gleason** for a pilgrimage through **Italy**, walking in the footsteps of **Saints Peter and Paul** and encountering the faith that took root in the early Church.

From April 20th through May 10th, 2026, pilgrims will travel through Naples, Rome, and Florence—three centers of faith, art, and history that together tell the story of Christianity's growth over its first 1,500 years. Participants will experience sacred spaces where Peter and Paul preached and were martyred, worship together in ancient basilicas, and reflect on the Gospel through art and architecture that continue to inspire hearts today.

The heart of the journey will be **ten days in Rome** (April 24th–May 5th), exploring sites such as St. Peter's Basilica, the Vatican Museums, the Catacombs, and the Basilicas of St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. John Lateran, and Santa Maria Maggiore. Optional extensions will allow travelers to begin in Naples – discovering Pompeii, early Christian churches, and Mount Vesuvius – or to conclude in Florence, with visits to Assisi, the Duomo, the Uffizi Gallery, and the masterpieces of the Renaissance.

This pilgrimage is more than a tour—it is a time of prayer, fellowship, and renewal. Each day will include opportunities for reflection and shared worship, with

Knowledgeable local guides will bring the history of each site to life, while moments of quiet and community meals will invite pilgrims to deepen friendships and faith alike.



Space is limited to 30 participants in Rome, and 20 in each optional extension (Naples and Florence). Reservations are on a **first-come**, **first-served** basis. A **non-refundable \$2,000 deposit** per person is due **by December 1**st, **2025**, with final payment due **February 1**st, **2026**. Pilgrimage brochures are available in the Parish Hall and can be <u>downloaded</u> here.





A highlight of the night was **Trinity Trivia**, which brought plenty of laughter and friendly competition, making for a truly memorable evening together.












